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## Champagne and Sparkling Wines



The majority of the grapes used for vinification come from a radius of 20km around Epernay, where the Grand Crus of Pinot Noir, Pinot Meunier and Chardonnay co-exist, in the ethereal vineyards of the Montagne de Reims, the Vallée de la Marne and the Côte des Blancs.

The Billecart-Salmon Brut Réserve NV is a blend of 40% Pinot Meunier, 30% Chardonnay and 30% Pinot Noir. The most recent bottling contains around 40% of fruit from the 2015 harvest with the remainder topped up with reserve wines. The result is a light and delicately fruit-filled cuvée with aromatic and spicy notes from the Pinot Meunier. Further aromas include redcurrant, chalky notes and hints of ripe pears. The palate is round, elegant and finessed, leading to an intense, persistent, well-structured and saline finish.

### **Domaine Jonathan et Didier Pabiot**

When we first visited Domaine Pabiot in the small village of Les Loges in the Pouilly- Fumé appellation, it was being run by Didier. We were impressed by his wines but, as he went to leave, Didier asked us to taste one final cuvée. He had given his son, Jonathan, 2 hectares of land to experiment with and this was his first vintage.

“I know what you are going to say”, Didier piped up... “His wines are better than mine aren’t they? You wouldn’t be the first person to tell me that.” We meekly nodded our heads in agreement. Jonathan’s wines certainly showed lots of promise. Soon after, Didier handed over control of the Domaine to his son and, in a role reversal, now works under his guidance – a rare occurrence in the traditional world of French winemaking.

One of our youngest producers, Jonathan’s wines are organically certified and he employs many biodynamic principles in an effort to ensure that his wine gives a true representation of the magical terroirs of Pouilly-Fumé. Consistently voted among the best winemakers in France, he is being touted as the successor to French winemaking superstar Didier Dagueneau – high praise indeed!

**Describe BLANKbottle in one sentence:** Clothes maketh not the man; judge my wines on what's in the bottle, not the varietal on the label.

In 2004, a lady came to my house (then also my office) to buy wine. She asked for anything but Shiraz. "I don't drink Shiraz", were her exact words. I poured her a glass of wine. She loved it and bought 3 cases. It was a straight Shiraz. It's a fact - we do judge the book by its cover.

When I started BLANKbottle, my goal was to create an honest wine brand that had no limitations when it came to style, vintage, area or cultivars in order to break down any preconceived expectations. Having no indication of cultivar on the bottle makes this possible. Not only does it demand complete honesty when it comes to quality, but it allows me the opportunity to introduce once-off limited runs of interesting wines. Its flexibility turned out to be BLANKbottle's edge. Something for someone with an open mind and an adventurous heart

### CLOS CANTENAC

Covering 6 hectares of St. Emilion Grand Cru vineyards, Clos Cantenac benefits from an enviable terroir of deep gravel, sand and clay over limestone soils. Martin Krajewski (owner of Chateau de Sours), who purchased the vineyard in 2007, has found the perfect balance between experimenting with this intriguing variation in soil structures, while simultaneously respecting the history of the land. Martin and his team produce wines which do full justice to this prized terroir, highlighting why St. Emilion is one of the most desirable winemaking locations in the world.

### Gianni Gagliardo

The history of the Gianni Gagliardo estate can be traced back to 1847, when the Colla family first began working vineyards in the area. At that stage, grapes were sold to other local winemakers. However, in the 1960s, fourth generation grape grower Paolo Colla took matters in to his own hands and began to bottle his own wine.

Paolo's daughter Marivanna married Gianni Gagliardo in the early 1970s and together they established the winery in its current form. Nowadays the sixth generation of the family is at the helm, headed by their sons Stefano (oenology), Alberto (viticulture), and Paolo (business). Over the years, Gagliardo has gradually purchased land in many of the best vineyards in the townships of La Morra, Verduno, Barolo, Serralunga, and Monforte d'Alba, the very heart of the Barolo appellation, and in Monticello d'Alba in the Roero district.

Vineyards are always acquired with the same objective in mind, to uncover the finest possible expression of Nebbiolo that each individual terroir can offer. The Gagliardo brothers now preside over 23 hectares of vineyards, producing some of the regions finest wines. They have always based the management of their vineyards on maximum respect for the vines and the soil, highlighted by their conversion to organics in 2017. In order to offer the drinker as accurate an insight as possible to their unique terroirs, no selected yeasts are added during fermentation. Additionally, all their wines are left unfiltered, instead they are naturally stabilised by a cold winter in the cellar.

### Els Jelpins

The Spanish estate of Els Jelpins was born from the desire to create a viticultural family project that would allow Glòria and her daughter Berta to live in the hills of Font Rubi near Barcelona, enjoying a life of moderation in which they could find personal enrichment in tandem with the forces of mother nature and appreciation of the simpler things in life. In 2001, this former engineer looked for the best plots of vineyards around Font Rubi, with special characteristics of soil, vine and climate. She found them in Penedès Superior. Glòria selects the grapes from various hillside vineyards cultivated without a single chemical or any other aggressive activity that disrupt nature's natural flow. She carefully works each vineyard separately, adjusting to its individual needs and potential. She's in favour of achieving a fruit that can mature naturally and healthily without becoming trapped by a particular dogma or strict regime. Since 2003, Glòria has been making this now iconic wine with a production of barely 2,000 bottles. She mainly uses a very old indigenous red grape variety called Sumoll, which almost totally disappeared from Spain, but she also puts some Garnacha (equivalent to Grenache) in the wine. If you try to ask Glòria about the name Els Jelpins, she will tell you that it's a name without meaning but a name with feeling that is magical and strong.

### DE MARTINO

Originally established by Italian winemaker Pietro De Martino Pascualone in 1934, De Martino is one of the most forward-thinking estates in all of South America.

Located in Isla de Maipo, a small town around 50 kilometres from the Chilean capital of Santiago, the estate is entirely organic and also uses production methods that render their wines completely carbon-neutral.

The estate is located in a prime viticultural position, on the banks of the now arid Maipo River. The fact the valley previously accommodated the ferocious torrents of the Maipo gives soil conditions which are unique in the region, alluvial earth with high silt levels - great for the cultivation of vines.

Today, proceedings are controlled by the third and fourth generations of the De Martino family who continue to strive to improve the quality of their produce as well as leave as little impact on nature as possible.

### Finca Ambrosia

The estate came to life in 2002 when a group of wine lovers joined forces with the ambition of producing gastronomic, terroir-driven wines that showed the intricacies and nuances of the district of Gualtallary in Mendoza's Uco Valley. Nowadays, the estate covers an area of 65 hectares, comprising site-specific sub-plots that ensure all varieties are cultivated in small parcels that will bring the best possible results. This painstaking approach has been spearheaded by globally renowned Chilean terroir expert Pedro Parra, ensuring the Ambrosia team maximise the full potential of their unique spot in the Valley. Such has been the rise of Finca Ambrosia's reputation that, as well as producing their own signature wines, their fruit has now become some of the most sought after in the region, with a handful of high end producers now turning to them to purchase grapes for special, one-off bottlings.

### Ramos Pinto

Founded in 1880 by brothers Adriano and Antonio, this Port house has always had a pioneering spirit. In the early 20th century it became noted for its innovative and enterprising commercial strategies including the distinctive art nouveau advertising campaign. Ramos Pinto is run today by the heirs of these two energetic vintners: Jorge Rosas, Export Director and João Nicolau de Almeida, the enologist who was responsible for officially identifying the five key grape varieties (out of over 70 originally grown) that are best suited to wine production in the Douro region. His findings have been adopted by the authorities for all new plantings. In addition he introduced and developed vertical vine planting techniques in the region and has advanced Port and wine vinification by building two of the most modern wineries in the whole Douro region (at Quinta do Bom Retiro and Quinta dos Bons Ares).

All situated in the areas of the Cima-Corgo and the Douro Superior, the four quintas or estates that make up Ramos Pinto's holdings are: Quinta do Bom Retiro: in Pinhão, planted exclusively with red varieties. Quinta da Urtiga: adjacent to Bom Retiro. Quinta da Ervamoira: in the far upper Douro, by the Côa river near the Spanish border. Here the grapes grow in dry semi-desert conditions. Quinta dos Bons Ares: a cooler site with some of the highest vineyards in the Douro. Both red and white varieties ripen here with great natural acidity and fresh flavours. The award-winning ten- and twenty year-old Tawnies are produced at Quinta da Ervamoira and Bom Retiro respectively.
